After this has hardened, break up into pieces, similar to peanut brittle.

1 bag (10 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz) corn chips (Fritos)

1 cup light corn syrup

1 cup sugar

1 cup peanut butter

1 bag (12 oz) mini chocolate chips

Crush corn chips and place in a 15 x 10 x 1 pan.

Bring corn syrup and sugar to a boil.

Remove from heat and stir in peanut butter.

Pour over corn chips.

Sprinkle chocolate chips over the top and allow to melt.

When cool, cut or break into pieces.
