- Remember to bring anything you've done for Show & Tell. We can all use the motivation of others.
- GEMS of HOPE has contacted us and we are discussing possible dates with them. Possibly April or May we will have them at our meeting again.
- Club member Michelle Bell has asked if we would like to make curtains for the Jane Boyd Community House. We will have more information available at the meeting so we can discuss it.




