Here's a recipe we make all the time at our house. My sister requested that I put it in the newsletter, so here it is.

## ***Cool Whip Layer Jell-O***



1 large box of Jell-O, any flavor

2 cups boiling water

1 semi-thawed 8 oz container of Cool Whip (I usually use Lite Cool Whip)

Fruit (optional)

Stir the boiling water into the Jell-O powder until dissolved.

Then whisk the Cool Whip into the hot Jell-O mixture until it is all melted.

Pour into a container and let it cool for a while.

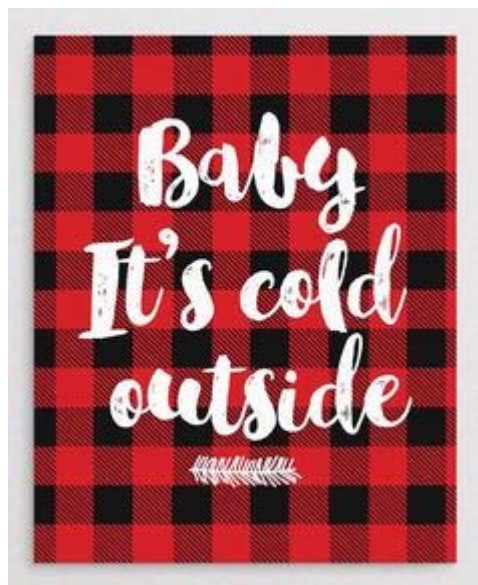
Then put it in the refrigerator until firm. It will separate into two layers during the chilling process.

If you want to add fruit, do it after you pour the liquid into your final container.
