Here's a couple of recipes from a cookbook that shows you how to start with a cake mix and make something else out of it.

Coconut Clouds

- 1 package (about 16 ounces) confetti angel food cake mix
- ½ cup water
- 1½ cups sweetened flaked coconut
- 1¼ cup slivered almonds, divided



1. Preheat oven to 325°F. Line cookie sheets with parchment paper; set aside.
2. Beat cake mix and water in large bowl with electric mixer at medium-high speed 3 minutes or until fluffy. Add coconut and 1 cup almonds; beat until combined. Drop tablespoonfuls dough 2 inches apart onto prepared cookie sheets. Sprinkle tops with remaining ¼ cup almonds.
3. Bake 18 to 20 minutes or until bottoms are golden brown. Cool 1 minute on cookie sheets. Remove to wire rack; cool completely.

Makes about 4 dozen cookies

Moon Rocks

- 1 package (about 18 ounces) devil's food or German chocolate cake mix with pudding in the mix
- 3 eggs
- ½ cup (1 stick) butter, melted
- 2 cups slightly crushed (2½-inch) pretzel sticks
- 1½ cups uncooked old-fashioned oats
- 1 cup swirled chocolate and white chocolate chips or candy-coated semisweet chocolate baking pieces

1. Preheat oven to 350°F.
2. Combine cake mix, eggs and butter in large bowl; mix well. Stir in pretzels, oats and chocolate chips. (Dough will be stiff.) Drop dough by rounded tablespoonfuls 2 inches apart onto ungreased cookie sheets.
3. Bake 7 to 9 minutes or until set. Cool 1 minute on cookie sheets. Remove to wire racks; cool completely.

Makes about 5 dozen cookies

Tips and Tricks and Money Saving Ideas:

Clean or change out your car's air filter.
