COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT: This past month we collected money to help send boxes to the troops in Iraq. The program is sponsored by the Red Cross and is called Treasure for Troops. We collected enough money to buy two packages. Each package will include a deck of cards, a book of crossword puzzles, snacks, games, sunscreen lotion, tissues, a Hackey Sack ball, moist towelettes, a hand-held fan and a multi-tool all packaged in a light-weight, durable, reusable bag.

This month we will be collecting for the Jane Boyd Community House and the Community Health Free Clinic. Here is their wish list:

Paper products: Paper towels, large and small paper plates, napkins, cups (paper, plastic and Styrofoam), diapers (any size).

Cleaning supplies: Liquid dish soap, liquid hand soap, Clorox disinfectant wipes, Comet, Febreze, window cleaner, brooms and dustpans.

Group activities supplies: Magic markers, games, six rubber 8" balls, jump ropes, disposable cameras.

Food Supplies: Granola snack bars, small cans of pop (Diet Coke, Pepsi, Sprite), large cans of juice, snack crackers, snack size canned mixed fruits.

Clinic items: Robitussin DM or generic brand DM (4 oz. bottles), Zantac, Band-Aids, and diabetic snack bars.

Also, empty prescription bottles with labels removed.

As an ongoing project, we are going to continue to help out our Christmas Adopt-A-Family. They have almost no furniture, so if you have any furniture that's still in pretty good shape that you would like to donate, please let Zona or Gloria know. Pickup can be arranged if needed. We received a thank you for the cards and McDonald gift certificates we sent them for Valentine's Day and for all the other items that have been donated. Vi Brislawn donated two framed pictures, Betty Johnston brought clothing, and Mary Kay Hartley brought some miscellaneous items. We also received some donations of dishes, silverware, food, backpacks, a lamp, throw pillows, and towels from sources outside the club.
